Priorities/overview of plan agreed with partner organisations	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Priorities to be decided - At the December 2022 Board meeting, Worcester Council Public Health provided an updated report on the health demographic of Bromsgrove and District. The board will discuss the report at the next meeting in January 2023 to agree priorities going forward. Key issues include mental health and obesity.• Partnership opportunities are being explored, for example between the PCN and Bromsgrove District Housing Trust. The project with BDHT and their residents aims to improve health, wellbeing and housing concerns, BDHT to send out survey to agreed cohort of their residents to find out their views on what they need/want – health and housing wise. Utilisation of current assets along with some of the IAPT counselling, where needed, and a GP is in place who will provide a medical/clinical overview.• Improve links between health and other partners including Act on Energy. Act on Energy and the social prescribing team are joined up to ensure all patients within the PCN are aware of the help available.• Being Well Funding Bid - The funding will be a contribution towards the Wellbeing Lead function. The funding is required to ensure there is the necessary capacity to deliver an integrated wellbeing approach in Bromsgrove and District.
