Integrating VCSE and NHS Mental Health and Wellbeing Services

Worcestershire VCSE presented with a significant opportunity to enhance mental health services throughout the county

Through the allocation of 12 months of funding by the Herefordshire and Worcestershire Health and Care Trust, the Worcestershire VCSE Alliance will work towards integrating services and effectively addressing the unmet needs within existing mental health services across both <u>primary and secondary care</u>.

Carole Cumino, Alliance Executive Lead is supporting this work until the new Programme Manager is in post. The project is being run by the Alliance Mental Health Steering Group chaired by Steve Brewster, <u>CEO of Active Worcestershire</u>.

There are 5 key strands of work:

- Delivering specific 'Managing Emotions' groups to people in Redditch (the area with the longest waiting lists for these groups)
- Expanding group provision in other areas based on those areas with the longest waiting lists – using the model developed for Redditch
- Building on successful provision already provided by the VCSE, specifically the Community Mental Health Transformation programme
- 4. Working out a means of providing funding to local organisations to support mental ill-health prevention work

5. Working with the VCSE to be involved in the following longer term tender opportunity:

<u>Voluntary, Community, and Social Enterprise Mental</u> <u>Health Services - Find a Tender (find-tender.service.gov.uk)</u>

The main purpose of this funding will be to:

'shape community mental health pathways and have the capability and capacity of delivering mental health interventions in collaboration with statutory sector partners through a population health management approach.'

Next steps for integrating primary care Fuller Stocktake report

What does this new way of working mean for VCSE organisations?

The <u>Fuller Stocktake</u> is a report commissioned by the Government that outlines a new vision for integrating <u>primary</u> <u>care</u> in England. The report highlights the critical role of the voluntary, community, and social enterprise (VCSE) sector in delivering integrated primary care and improving population health outcomes. It recommends that <u>integrated care systems</u> (ICSs) should work closely with VCSE partners to co-design and co-deliver services that meet the needs and preferences of local communities.

This session will provide an overview of the findings from the Fuller Stocktake report and look at existing collaborations between Primary Care Networks (PCN) and the sector. We will cover -

- What this new way of working mean for Voluntary,
 Community and Social Enterprise sector organisations.
- How can the sector play a part in building integrated teams in every neighbourhood?
- How Primary Care Networks are working with the sector already, with an opportunity to hear from some of our local PCNs.
