Regular personnel – any current serving members of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, British Army or Royal Air Force.

Volunteer and regular reservists – Royal Naval Reserve, Royal Marine Reserve, Royal Auxiliary Air Force, Royal Fleet Reserve, Army Reserve and Air Force Reserve, Royal Fleet Auxiliary and Merchant Navy (where individuals served on a civilian vessel whilst supporting the Armed Forces).

Veterans – anyone who has served for at least a day in the Armed Forces as either a regular or a reservist, or Merchant Mariners who have seen duty on legally defined military operations.

Families of regular personnel, reservist and veterans – spouses, civil partners and children, and where appropriate can include parents, unmarried partners and other family members.

Bereaved – the family members of Service personnel and veterans who have died, whether that death is connected to their Service or not.



The Armed Forces Covenant Legal Duty

The Covenant Legal Duty is a legal obligation on certain public bodies to have due regard to the <u>Covenant principles</u> when carrying out certain functions in healthcare, education, and housing.

The public bodies subject to this Legal Duty include local authorities, governing bodies of certain statefunded schools, and various NHS bodies.

The Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust (the Trust) awards grants that support the Armed Forces community.

AFCFT are both a charity and a Non-Departmental Public Body, or NDPB who deliver high impact programmes, including administration of the £10 million Armed Forces Covenant Fund, each year. AFCFT Funding Themes

- Non-core healthcare services for Veterans.
- 2. Removing barriers to family life.
- 3. Extra support, both in and after Service, for those that need help.
- 4. Measures to integrate military and civilian communities and allow the Armed Forces community to participate as citizens

- ➤ Can you identify an Armed Forces champion for your organisation?
- > Could they represent your organisation at local Armed Forces Partnership meetings?
- ➤ Could you include an Armed Forces module on your induction training?
- > Do your HR policies support the families of serving personnel or reservists?
- ➤ Have you signed the Armed Forces Covenant, or have you applied for the Employer Recognition Scheme?
- ➤ Have you considered the implications of the Armed Forces Covenant Legal Duty, and the upcoming changes on your organisation? Do you pay due regard to the Armed Forces in your work?
